

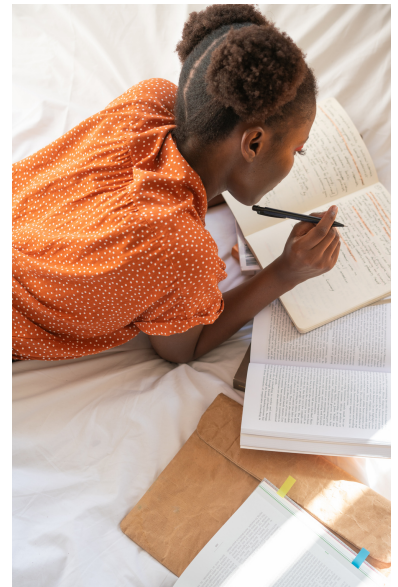


# WRITING AT HOLMER LAKE

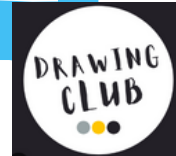


RMW

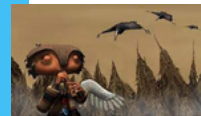


In Class 5J, they have been writing a narrative for their story video 'Wing.'
