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The Early Years Foundation Stage

- This is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of their reception year.
- It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.
- At Holmer Lake the EYFS curriculum is delivered with a balance of adult led, adult directed and child initiated provision.



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The Early Years Curriculum.

There are 7 areas of learning

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development
- Communication and Language
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design.





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The Early Years Curriculum.

Activities in reception are carefully planned and organised in order to provide a range of learning experiences.

Learning journeys are used to record the activities that your child undertakes, showing their progress in specific skills.


The children work towards the Early Learning Goals. These describe the level of attainment expected at the end of your child's reception year in school.

Outdoor area.




Resources are provided to allow children to access all areas of the curriculum.

Every week we go to the woods to play and learn. The children have the opportunity to explore, investigate and problem solve. As well as develop skills such as resilience, team work and managing risks.

Reading






Read Write inc phonics lessons take place every morning. To begin with this is a 20 minute lesson building up to 50 minutes in the Spring Term.







Helping your child learn to read.

Share stories and books regularly, talking to your child about the characters and events.







Practise the sound cards that will be sent home with your child.

Once your child has learnt the first set of sounds they will begin to bring home a "ditty" and then a reading book.





We will invite you to join us for one of your child's RWI lessons.



Snacks, Drinks and Lunches

A mid morning snack of toast is available for parents and carers to purchase via parent pay. 30p per day.


Fruit is provided free of charge.

Brilliant Brushes.








We take part in the supervised teeth brushing programme called Brilliant Brushes. The children clean their teeth after lunch.

Absence and Attendance



- All children are expected to have an attendance of 95% or more.
- The classroom door opens 8.40am.
- To be a hero your child needs to be in class by 8.50am.
- Rewards are given to children who are heros!
- If your child is not well enough for school you must notify school by phone.
- Not giving a reason for your child's absence can result in the absence being unauthorised.
- Holidays during term time will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- The Education Welfare office visits school every three weeks to monitor attendance of all pupils.


