PE and sport premium for primary schools

Schools with primary-age pupils receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years One to Six. The money has been provided to enable schools to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

Physical Education and Sport are an essential part of school life at Holmer Lake Primary. Over the last 12 months we have been looking carefully at how we can improve the PE curriculum and the provision we offer our children. We encourage all children to have an active lifestyle and take part in school clubs, competitions and events.

Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons;
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs;
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers;
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in sport activities;
- run sports activities with other schools.

Since September 2013, Ofsted inspections report on PE and sport provision and on how schools will spend their additional funding.
